Introduction:

In Pakistan, 44.7% (source; the world bank) of people are living below the poverty line, indicating a profound need for immediate action to help alleviate the situation. While Madinatul Ilm Charitable Trust (MICT) is committed to a variety of avenues for helping those in need, its ultimate objective is to end the suffering of vulnerable population groups. MICT believes that every human being has the right to live a life of self-respect, dignity and economic security.

MICTs objectives are:

- To promote the cause of human welfare through charitable activities, especially in the realm of imparting knowledge and education for the benefit of mankind and humanity in need.
- To cooperate with other like-minded individuals, groups and associations involved in similar undertakings, to foster collective goodwill through mutual cooperation.
- To place special emphasis on the principle of human wellbeing through literacy and educational promotion being the supreme goal for mankind.
- To promote all aspects of human welfare and charity, in all fields through all available means and resources, to intervene in crises-stricken situations, wherever they arise in Pakistan.

OUR WORK AT A GLANCE

Here are the areas and disbursements made by MICT during the financial year 2021-2022:

1. Education Program:

Educational grants are the single most important initiative to break the cycle of poverty. In principle, MICT's educational projects encompass all areas pertaining to education. In the reporting period, MICT provided support to students receiving formal education regardless of age, gender, grade or location. PKR 1,461,886 were spent to support 20 students. Our work in this area will continue in the coming year.

2. Health Program:

MICT provides support to patients in need. During the financial year 2021-2022, MICT disbursed PKR 2,060,000 to eight patients in need of financial assistance.



3. Water & Sanitation Program:

MICT aims to improve access to usable water and promote better sanitation practices among rural communities. During the financial year 2021-2022, MICT spent PKR 963,000 in different water scarce areas of Muzaffargarh, Jhang, Skardu and Tharparkar to support water supply and sanitation schemes.



4. Ramzan Food Program:

MICT continues to reach out to individuals in need of food during the holy month of 'Ramzan' when inflation affects household budgets of the poorest. The food packs during the year 2021-2022 were delivered to 1000 families comprising at least 7000 individuals. The total cost of these food packs was Rs. 2,604,900



5. Capacity Building & Livelihood Program:

During the year 2021-2022, MICT actively continued to search for impoverished individuals who were able and willing to establish businesses at the grass roots. PKR 302,620 were spent on 16 individuals to help them establish small businesses.



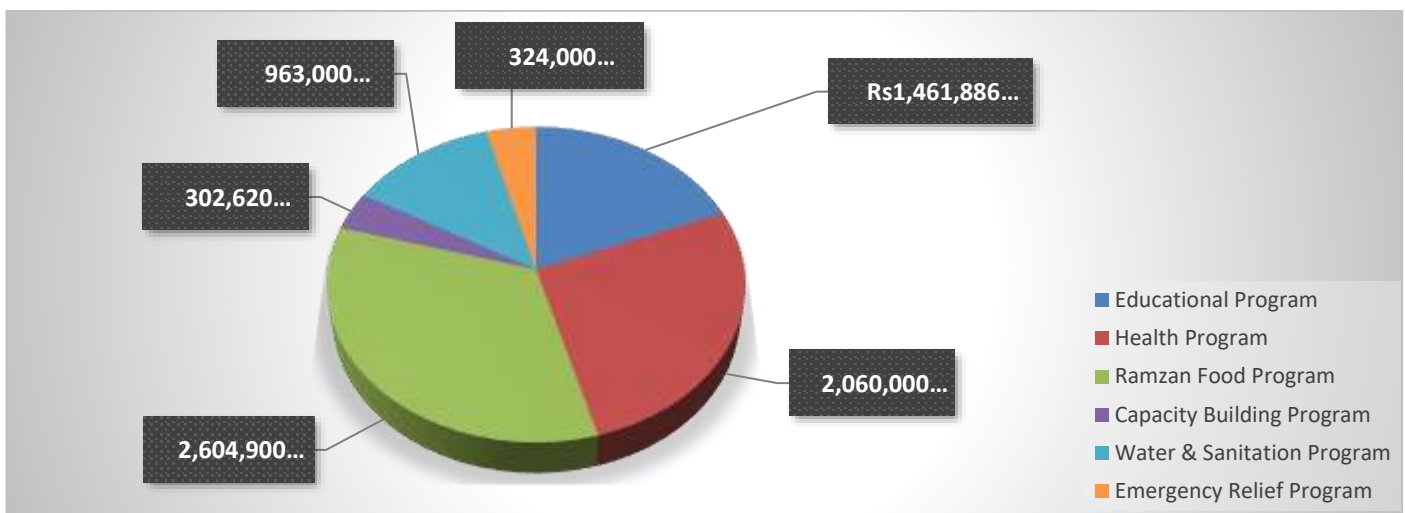
6. Emergency Relief Program:

Winter Supplies:

This is one of a kind project. More than 25 people died due to heavy snowfall in Murree (Punjab) this winter. MICT disbursed blankets worth PKR 324,000 amongst widows in Murree. In the same year, due to severe cold and fog, MICT disbursed warm sweaters in a rural school in Jhang (Punjab) where children from poor and impoverished families' study.
