Introduction:

In Pakistan, 44.7% (source; *The World Bank*) of people are living below the poverty line, indicating a profound need for immediate action to help alleviate the situation. While Madinatul Ilm Charitable Trust (MICT) is committed to a variety of avenues for helping those in need, its ultimate objective is to end the suffering of vulnerable population groups. MICT believes that every human being has the right to live a life of self-respect, dignity and economic security.

MICTs objectives are:

- To promote the cause of human welfare through charitable activities, especially in the realm of imparting knowledge and education for the benefit of mankind and humanity in need.
- To cooperate with other like-minded individuals, groups and associations involved in similar undertakings, to foster collective goodwill through mutual cooperation.
- To place special emphasis on the principle of human wellbeing through literacy and educational promotion being the supreme goal for mankind.
- To promote all aspects of human welfare and charity, in all fields through all available means and resources, to intervene in crises-stricken situations, wherever they arise in Pakistan.

OUR WORK AT A GLANCE

Here are the areas and disbursements made by MICT during the financial year 2023-2024:

1. Education Program:

MICT's education project primarily aims at providing financial support to well performing students regardless of age, gender, or location. During the reporting period, MICT spent PKR 1,448,104 to support the education of 17 students.

2. Health Program:

MICT's seeks to support health needs of poor and vulnerable patients. During the financial year 2023-2024, MICT provided PKR 935,000 to four such patients.



3. Water & Sanitation Program:

MICT spent PKR 5,945,200 on the installation of 167 handpumps in different water-scarce areas of Muzaffargarh, Jhang, Taunsa, Layyah, Kot Addu, Bhakkar, Bahawalnagar and Naushera. Water supply projects were also supported in Abbottabad and Jaffarabad.



4. Ramzan Food Program:

Prior to the start of the month of Ramzan, 745 food packs were given to approximately 4500 individuals in Chakwal, Rawalpindi (Punjab) and Islamabad (ICT). The total cost incurred was Rs. 3,723,000



5. Capacity Building & Livelihood Program:

During the year 2024, MICT actively continued to search for impoverished individuals who were able and willing to establish businesses at the grass roots. For this purpose, MICT provided goods worth PKR 400,000 to 11 individuals. In addition, MICT launched a new project in which forty (40) kg of wheat per head was distributed amongst 55 widows of Chakwal (Punjab). This wheat was bought from local poor farmers at a cost of Rs 200,000 with the objective of giving them financial support.

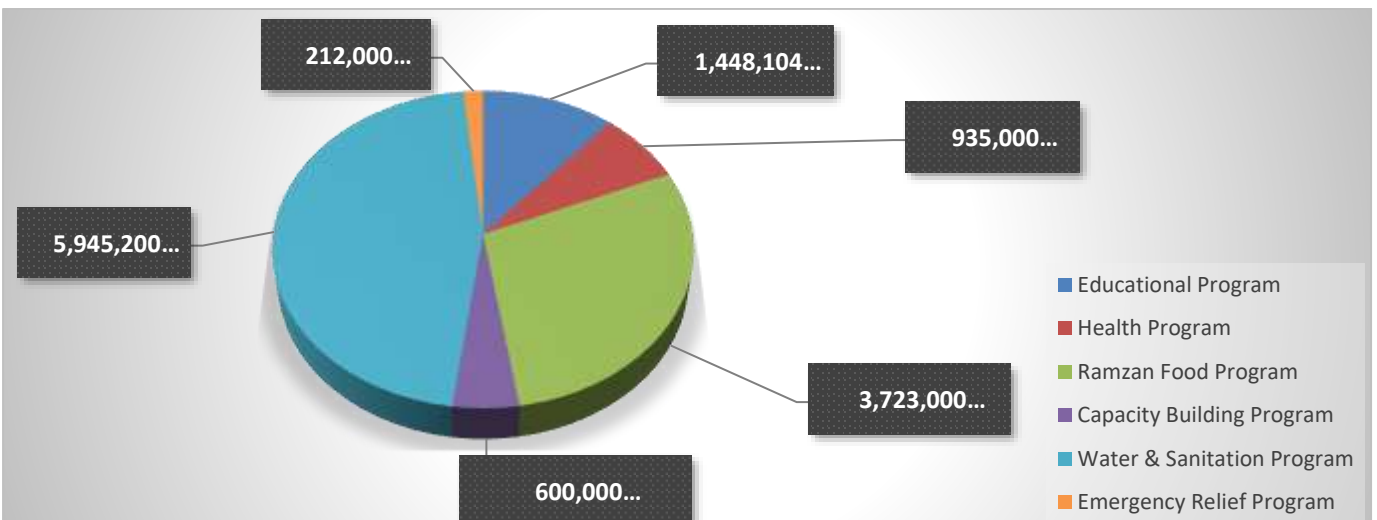


6. Emergency Relief Program:

MICT distributed summer clothes amongst 50 poor families of Rawalpindi (Punjab) with an amount of Rs. 85,000. MICT also built a room for a widow residing in a flood affected village of Azad Kashmir through Rs. 127,000.
